Explore the exhibition by **Carlo Crivelli**

The exhibition is called ***Shadows on the Sky***. What objects can you find that cast shadows in Crivelli's paintings?

Crivelli uses an art technique called trompe l'oeil, meaning "trick the eye".

Some of the objects are painted in a very realistic way to make people think they are real. Can you spot some examples?

Find the flies in Crivelli's paintings. How many can you point out?




Draw a portrait of yourself surrounded by images of nature. Could they act as symbols or have hidden meanings?

Britta Marakatt-Labba is a Sámi (Swedish) artist. The Sámi are an Indigenous population of the northernmost parts of Scandinavia.


The artist tells stories about Sámi culture through her embroidered artworks. Find the artwork titled ***Máilmmiávus/Cosmos***. What story do you think the artist is trying to tell?

The artist's work shows the effects of ongoing climate change.



How do you think climate change affects the Sámi population?
