Explore the exhibitions by **Salote Tawale, Osman Yousefzada and Yhonnie Scarce**

Salote's work *YOU, ME, ME, YOU* (2022) explores themes of friendship and distance. The artist reflects on experiences of isolation due to COVID-19 and how social media allows us to connect with others worldwide.

Osman's work *Spaces of Transcendence* (2022) is filmed in sites of ritual in Pakistan. The video features objects, signs and symbols. What objects represent you and your family's cultural identity?

Find *The Near Breeder* (2022). The glass shapes represent an explosion and a cloud of water, in memory of members of the artist's Aboriginal community.

Glass interacts with light in different ways. Watch as shadows appear and disappear throughout the day.



Explore the exhibition by **Abdulrazaq Awofeso**

The show is called **OUT OF FRAME** and includes sculptures made from wooden pallets.

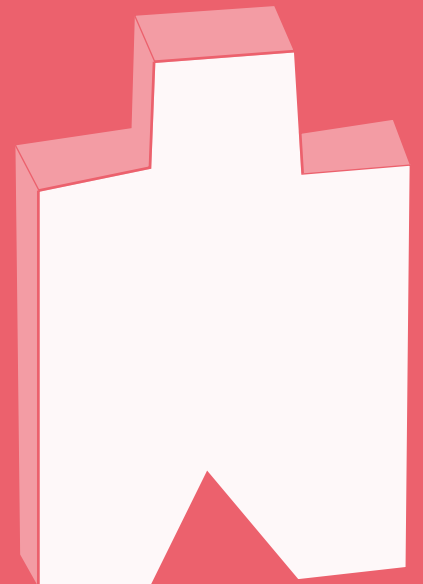
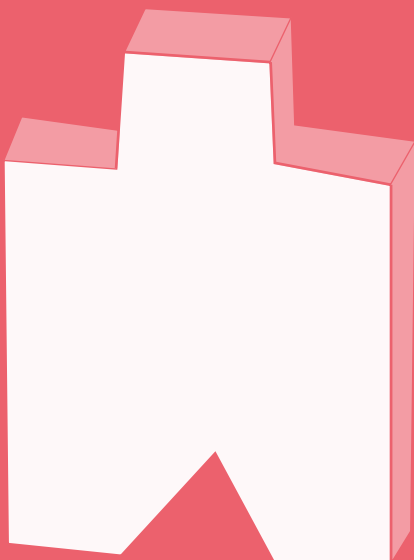
The first gallery contains sculptures of people the artist met during a flight from Lagos to Birmingham. Which sculpture is your favourite and why?
