



In the 1800s, this **printing press** was used to create nautical maps of the land and sea. Where is its current home and who uses it?


What is the ship in **Yinka Shonibare's** print called? Draw and colour one of the sails.

Wolverhampton School of Art first opened in 1851.

In 1970, it opened its iconic modernist building, including a print studio with a pair of antique printing presses.

The Blk Art Group formed at Wolverhampton School of Art in 1979.

This was a group of young Black artists who raised questions about what Black art was, its identity and what it could become in the future.
